Mainline: Marylebone rail station is a 10-minute walk. Also close by are Paddington, Euston, King's Cross and St Pancras stations.

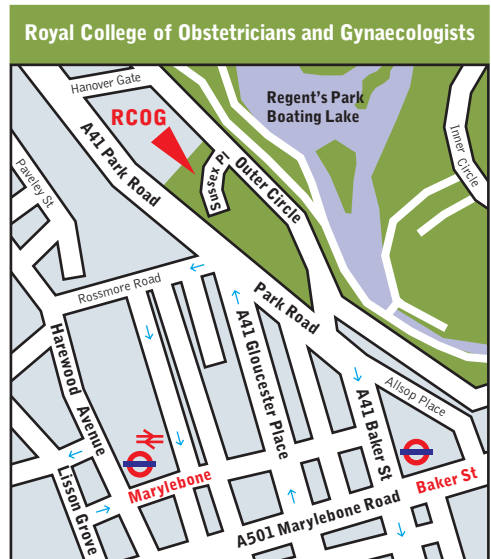
Buses: routes 13, 82, 113, 139, 189 and 274 serve the area.
